A Legacy Continues

CHS students lent hand in Higgins Memorial, set to be re-dedicated after 20 years on display

A monument honoring a man whose contributions aided in the United States victory in World War II, is celebrating its own milestone this fall.

The Andrew Jackson Higgins National Memorial will mark it's 20th Anniversary with a re-dedication ceremony on Sept. 20th in Columbus.

Columbus High School participated in the original design.

The following is from AndrewJacksonHiggins MemorialFoundation.org.

"On June 6, 2000 the Omaha World Heard published an article concerning the opening of the National D-Day Museum in New Orleans. The article stated the National D-Day Museum had been located in New Orleans in honor of Andrew Higgins and the workers of Higgins Industries, Inc. The article stated Andrew Higgins was born in Columbus, Nebraska.

"When Jerry Meyer, social studies teacher at Columbus High School, read the article. He thought it appropriate to present the information to his classes and ask if they would like to honor this very important man. They eagerly excepted this challenge. This was the beginning of a "Service Learning Project" which took three years to complete.

"His social studies students were divided into six committees. All of his students were given the opportunity to submit ideas that would like to see included in a memorial to Mr. Higgins. Local company Gilmore & Associates, donated the engineering, surveying and architectural services to the project. Their architect meet with the students. He jotted down each idea as it was presented. When the students and architect met again he had incorporated all their ideas into the memorial. The original plan was upgraded, but the outcome appears very much like the original architectural drawing.

"A State Historical Sign greets guests as they enter the memorial. The United States, MIA, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, along with the Nebraska and Louisiana state flags fly high above the Memorial Wall. Service flags of the Army, Navy, Marines, Merchant Marines, Coast Guard and Air Force line the sidewalk at the entrance to the memorial. Flags from each state and territory, along with flags specially made to honor Columbus High School staff and students surround the memorial." 20th Anniversary Higgins Re-Dedication Schedule

olumbus Public Schools gives its students the tools they need to build the careers they want. For some students, that means enjoying the security of a job with an existing company. For others, that means taking a risk and building something of their own.

Curt Kucera, for example, chose to embrace his entrepreneurial spirit and follow his passions - to careers in the beer brewing industry.

Curt Kucera CHS Class of 1976 Co-founder of Refuge Brewery



After graduating from Columbus High School in 1976, Curt Kucera went on to earn a bachelor of science degree in mechanical engineering from Oregon State in 1985. He then spent the next several decades doing high-level mechanical engineering across several industries and

Over his more than 35-year career, Kucera has done pioneering work in the engineering field. He helped create flight deck displays for Boeing 777 airplanes and ran a large engineering group at an automo-tive electronics company that helped pioneer the field of mobile entertainment.

He led a team that created some of the first programs for VHS/DVD players in major vehicles like Land Rover, Mercedes, GM and Toyota.

In his free time, Kucera had started experimenting with home brewing. When he started in the mid-1980s, the field was new and it was hard to find equipment and ingredients, but Kucera kept at it.

In December 2012, after years of home brewing in his garage and a year of building and preparing for the launch, Kucera opened Refuge Brewery at 43040 Rancho Way, #200 in Temecula, California.

The brewery is a family-run company as Kucera's wife, Diane Tredway (CHS class of 1977), and their sons, Jake and Chad, are also involved in the business. Jake is a co-founder

and marketing director for Refuge.

Chad - who completed a master brewer program in Germany - helps oversee
Refuge's diverse beers. Diane set up
Refuge's tasting room and serves
as the brewery's event director.
Early on, Refuge Brewery
signed a distribution deal with

Stone Brewing Company that allowed Refuge beers to be distributed throughout California. Now, Refuge beer (primarily the brewery's flagship brew, Blood Orange Wit) is sold

in more than 1,000 restaurants and bars throughout south-ern California.

Along with its success and growth, Refuge Brewery also paid off in another way - it

inspired Kucera to start another business.

During the development of Refuge Brewery, Kucera had designed much of the brewing equipment himself. These concepts and designs inspired Kucera to team up with a long-term business partner and friend to found Ss Brewtech which creates brew-

ing equipment.
Today, Ss Brewtech's equipment is shipped to more than 16 countries and the company is considered a leader in stainless steel home brewing

equipment. Though it's a global company, Ss Brewtech gets to test its equipment right at home at Refuge Brewery.

What led to you to you opening Refuge Brewery?/What inspired you to open Refuge Brewery?

After years of home brewing, and developing a local (neighborhood following) it felt right to

open up a brewery to provide a "Refuge" for craft beer lovers given the economic challenges that were hitting the country in 2012.

Originally, the brewery was planned to be very small, and serve as local brewery/taproom ... but our beers caught on and demand guided our growth

What education or experience prepared you to open a brewery?/How did your educa-tion and background lead to you starting Ss Brewtech?

I have a bachelor of science degree in mechanical engineering from Oregon State, and quality brewing is strongly influenced by "process control" - some-

thing that most engineers enjoy. As my home brewing progressed, I used my engineering process control to improve the quality of beers I made. Having an engineering

ultimately led (Rosen Products) where me to my first I was an owner and ran job... which the engineering departpaved the way After selling that for businesses I company, I had time to have owned.

Ss Brewtech started as a home brew equipment company, but we also added professional brewery equipment based on products I designed for Refuge Brewery.
Today, Ss Brewtech is sold worldwide and has brewery systems in thousands of breweries.

Did your experience at Columbus High School help prepare you for these business ventures? If so, how?

Everything is linked in some way. While in high school, I found a love for two things: automotive class and drafting. These skills I gained at CHS ultimately led me to my first job at NPPD as a draftsman, and later an engineering tech job at

This led me to go back to school for a bachelor of science in mechanical engineering which paved the way for businesses I have owned.

CHS Alumns Curt Kucera ('76) and his wife, Diane Tredway ('77) opened Refuge Brewery in 2012, after years of home brewing. The couple, along with their son Jake, rotate season flavors, styles and brews to serve patrons at their tap room as well as produce lines for more than 1,000 restaurants and bars around their Southern California home. "Originally, the brewery was planned to be very small, and serve as local brewery/taproom ... but our beers caught on and demand guided our growth," Kucera said. What do you want people to know about Refuge Brewery and your beers? What sets you apart from other breweries?

Refuge Brewery focuses on Belgian style beers, because they are my favorite styles.

But we also offer beers we call "sessionable" beers that are easy drinking, low in alcohol by volume and calories.

Beers that are Grand Cru, styles which are barrel-aged and often include juice from wine grapes which are grown locally in the region. And of course, we have a full line of IPAs which still dominate the craft beer market.

What do you like most about running a brewery?

Creativity. Brewing beer is a wildly creative activity. There are literally thousands of styles of beers and millions of ingredients which can be combined to personalize beers we brew.

What's your favorite memory of Columbus High School?

It was a high school dance where I first danced to "Stairway to Heaven" with Diane Tredway, who would one day become my wife and partner in all the twists and turns of life.

What advice do you have for current CPS students who may be interested in opening a brewery or another type of business someday?

Take a risk...be an entrepreneur in how you behave even if you're working for someone else. When I decided to go back to school for an engineering degree, I was taking a risk leaving a very good job at NPPD, but it paid off with a foundation to reach for

After working for Honeywell for 13 years in aerospace engineering, I left to enter the private sector, I was taking a risk again.

That risk led to companies I've had ownership in like Rosen Products, Refuge Brewery, 801 Brewing, Ss Brewtech, Haven Vineyard. These all paid off in a variety of ways from financial to personal growth and satisfaction.
