

A HEART FOR Home and Education

For Candace "Candy" Dickenson Becher, Columbus has always been more than just home. It's where her love for learning, teaching and community has flourished for decades.

A proud Columbus High School graduate from the Class of 1969, Candy went

on to dedicate 35 years to Columbus Public Schools. teaching English and advising the school newspaper before retiring in 2012.

Her story weaves together deep roots, lifelong friendships and a passion for education that continues to shape future generations of CHS students.

HIGH SCHOOL MEMORIES and Lasting Lessons

When Candy reflects on her CHS days, her memories are filled with friendship, music and creativity.

"We had dances at the City Auditorium at least a couple times each month with live rock bands — it was fantastic," she said with excitement.

Although sports opportunities for girls were limited at the time, she stayed busy with the school newspaper, choir, musicals, Thespians and Pep Club.

Her favorite teacher, Goldie Hagenbuck, nurtured Candy's love for literature, while her journalism teacher, Mr. Lacey, sparked her interest in current

Even in retirement, Candy hasn't slowed down. She continues to teach college composition to CHS seniors as an adjunct instructor for Central Community College, serves on the CPS School

Board, and stays active in three book clubs and several community organizations.

She also enjoys spending time with her son. Blake (CHS Class of 2006), her daughter-in-law Leigh Cerny Becher (also a CHS alum), and her beloved pets.

• • • Candy began her

teaching career in a small Nebraska town near the Wyoming border.

"It was almost in Wyoming," she laughed! "I taught all 9-12th graders, was the cheerleader and pep squad advisor, directed the school play and acted

as librarian."

Missing her hometown, she soon returned to Columbus, ready to pour her energy into the same school that has shaped her.

"It was a baptism by fire for a first-year teacher, but it prepared me for everything that came next."

A TEACHER WHO

Made a Difference

During her 35 years at CHS, Candy taught college preparatory literature and writing to juniors and advised the school newspaper. She also helped develop inter-

disciplinary courses like Humanities and American Studies, collaborating with colleagues from the English, history and art departments.

"It was the best teaching experience of my career," she said. "Students who took those classes still point to them as mind-opening opportunities."

For Candy, the most rewarding part of teaching has always been the relationships with students, fellow teachers, and the community.

"It's not just a job, it's a passion. You have to give your best to students even when it's difficult, because you are helping to shape the future."

LOOKING BACK

and Forging Ahead

When asked to describe CHS in three words, Candy's answer is simple and heartfelt: "Feels like home."

That sense of belonging, of giving back to the place that shaped her, defines her legacy

Her advice to today's students and young educators is equally timeless. "Enjoy your time in school because

it passes too quickly! You have to 'adult' for the rest of your life ... slow down and live in the moment."

From the classroom to the community. Becher's story is a reminder of what makes Columbus Public Schools special — a place where learning, connection and home truly come together.


